Theme for Fall 2020:

Our theme for the fall program year of 2020 is "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Ps 119:105). When faith communities attend God's word by reading and studying and meditating on its meaning and significance, and implement its wisdom, those communities are led to wholeness and fulfillment, righteousness and peace.

The focus of sermons in worship through the end of October will sharpen that theme centering on the Decalogue or the "Ten Words," otherwise known as the Ten Commandments (Exodus 20:1-17). The Ten Commandments were given to a community that had been enslaved for 400 years in order to provide these newly freed people with relevant patterns of justice and dignity and responsibility. Understood properly, the commandments can guide us in our challenging moment in time as well.

Mark has provided a study guide for the congregation to use during the series which can be found and downloaded from GPMC's website. You are encouraged to read the scripture and engage the questions from each week's study prior to the sermon. This week will be Study #6. All sermons will be recorded and broadcast at 9am on Sundays, and can be found on the website or our YouTube channel.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION



This fall we are introducing a new online Sunday school offering for children, youth and parents, called **Family Faith Playlists**. Because we cannot have in-person Sunday school this fall, Family Faith Playlists offers families an opportunity to stay connected with one another and continue to build the foundational relationships that are such an important part of our faith formation.

What is Family Faith Playlists? The playlists will be in three different modules: Foundational Bible Stories, Growing in Faith and Outreach. Each playlist will include a Bible story, videos, discussion questions and several activities that families can do at home. Activities may include devotionals, downloadable printouts, books, fun surprises and links to additional resources. These playlists are designed to be flexible, allowing families or small groups to pick the videos and activities that work best for them. They are designed for families with children from newborn through high school and all activities and resources will be labeled with suggested age ranges.

There are two ways for families to participate:

1. Choose a playlist on the GPMC website and work through it at their own pace. 2. A family can join a small group of up to 4 families and use the playlists together. This can be done through an online sign-up, where families can pick a specific small group or ask to be assigned to one. Once the groups are formed, they can determine how and when they will gather to do the playlists together. It is suggested that families take turns leading the whole group in a playlist, so the responsibilities are shared for all the details and a link to the sign up sheet for small groups.

When does Family Faith Playlists begin? Anytime! All the details for the playlists and small group sign-up can be found on the GPMC website.

Novel as Theology in September: “Novel” returns on Sept. 23, 7:30pm, via Zoom after a bit of a summer break. Don Ditmars has chosen *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*, by Mark Twain, as our first read for the new “school year,” and will be guiding the discussion. It has been a long time since most of us have read that wonderful piece, published in the U.K. in 1884 and in this country in 1885, by one of America’s most talented and observant writers. Middle Hour September 20 and the Evening of September 20: Created in God’s Image: The Way Forward for Justice and Peace: We have the opportunity to continue our education and transformation around race, white privilege, and the work of anti-racism by joining with Myers Park Presbyterian Church (Charlotte, North Carolina) for a two-part series led by Christena Cleveland, Ph.D. Dr. Cleveland is a social psychologist, public theologian, author and activist who will be presenting (via Zoom) at 10am and 7pm, Sunday, September 20th. The congregation of GPMC is quickly moving into its next phase of the interim process. Leaders of the History-to-our-Story Team and the Mission Study Team are concluding their work. A mission study produced by the MST will soon be in the hands of the Session, and, with their approval, into the hands of the Presbytery of Detroit. A date for completion of this process could be as early as October. When this phase is complete, the next step will be the election of a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC).

In anticipation of this next phase, the Session has received approval from Detroit Presbytery to begin the process of assembling names of people who will be considered, vetted, and nominated for election to the PNC at a congregational meeting. At this point, our Nominations Committee can receive from the congregation suggestions of names of members who are recommended for consideration to serve on the PNC.

So, during the month of September, you may forward name suggestions to the Nominating Committee who you believe could represent the congregation well in the pastoral search process.

Who would be a good candidate to suggest for the PNC? Here are some criteria:

- Active member in the life of the congregation
 - o Participates in worship regularly
 - o Engages in bible study through Sunday School or small group
 - o Financially supports the church
 - o Volunteers and leads
 - o Engages in mission outreach
 - o Spiritually sound, wise, and grounded
- Familiar with the people and attitudes and values and mission of GPMC
- Works well in a group and with a group process, contributing progress to the group's agenda and goals
- Shares several of the skills needed by the PNC, including:
 1. Leadership of group process
 2. Analytical and insightful
 3. Spiritually sensitive
 4. Theologically and biblically informed in the Reformed Tradition and Presbyterian policy
 5. Good judge of character/people
 6. Writer/wordsmith
 7. Familiar with GPMC Mission Study
 8. Articulate
 9. Able to listen to, and respect, differences of opinion
 10. Willing to offer alternate ideas even if novel or unpopular

- Will devote the time required for the demanding task of serving on the PNC

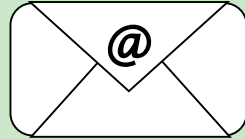

Cell Phone Recording

Record inside, in a quiet space.

1 Find a place inside to set your cell phone horizontally. So it is stationary while recording. Friends may have trouble holding the phone steady.



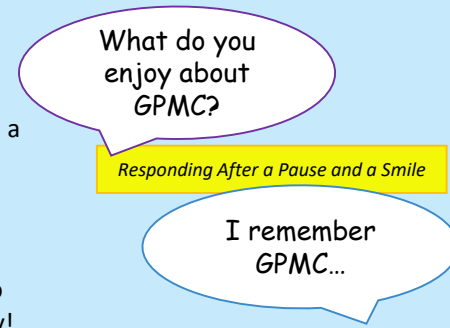
2 Make sure you are standing or seated in a way that your head is in the center of the video and that there are no windows or lights behind you.



3 Press record, set the phone in its position, and take your place. Do a test to make sure you are heard and seen correctly.



4 Now it's time to record. Repeat step 3 and once in position take a deep breath and smile. You can have people off screen prompt you with questions but please leave space between question and answer. Watch and listen to your recording to ensure quality!
