This Morning's Music: Features new sounds set to old forms of expression. The anthem composed by Indo-Dutch composer Maarten Bauer (b. 2000) is a charming duet for B-flat Clarinet and Alto Saxophone. The characteristics of the short piece take on the aesthetic of the late 18th century, much like the tunes of Haydn and Mozart. The clarinet introduces the main theme with the saxophone providing accompaniment before the piece moves forward with the two instruments trading back and forth motivic material in a playful manner. The offertory by Monte Mason (b. 1949) takes the hymn "'Tis Winter Now" by 19th century, American clergyman, Samuel Longfellow (1819-1892) and sets it as a choral duet. The tune that is passed between the duet-texture is based on a traditional English ballad air named for a village in North Yorkshire.




