

This Morning's Music: Mikhail Mikhaylovich Ippolitov-Ivanov (1859-1935) was a Russian composer, conductor, and teacher. His most famous music is the suite of orchestra pieces entitled "Caucasian Sketches." Today's anthem is part of the Russian Orthodox Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom.

As the offering is collected we hear "I Am Always With You," a song that uses a tune that James Biery composed some years ago for a project that was never completed. His wife Marilyn wrote the words in 2012. They were inspired by the final verse of the book of Matthew, in which Jesus says to his disciples, "Lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age."

On April 4, 1968, at 6:01 p.m., Dr. Martin Luther King was shot while standing on the second floor balcony of the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, surrounded by friends and associates. As he lay dying, he spoke these last words to his friend and musician Ben Branch, who was to perform at the event King was scheduled to attend that night: "Ben, make sure you play 'Take My Hand, Precious Lord' in the meeting tonight. Play it real pretty." King's funeral took place on April 9, 1968, at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, the church where both King and his father had served as co-pastors. His good friend Mahalia Jackson sang "Precious Lord" at the funeral.

DIGGING DEEPER

Middle Hour: CS Lewis Goes To Hell: "A Study of the Screwtape Letters," January 8 - 22. Oxford Don and Author CS Lewis burst onto the American stage with his Christian satire, "The Screwtape Letters." Written as a series of levels from a senior demon to a junior demon, Screwtape discusses the problem of temptation, the challenge of freewill and sin, and the battle between good and evil, all in a poignant, funny, thought-provoking way. Taught by Pastor Jeff, this three-week class will discuss some of the themes of the book, and how, through satire, Lewis provokes us towards a compelling vision of the God of the Christian faith. Participants are encouraged to read the Screwtape Letters alongside the class but is not mandatory. Join us in Barbour Chapel at 10:10am.
