POSTLUDE - Toccata on St. Denio

This Morning's Music: Features pastoral scenes of grace and joy with settings of two hymnal tunes that are inspired out of nature and folk traditions. The anthem arranged by American composer, Alice Parker (1925-2023) combines both the Sanctuary and Handbell Choirs using the American shape-note tune, "Land of Rest." The origins of this tune come out the Anglo-Scottish tradition of ballad singing with its gentle rise and fall of the melody line, while the rhythmic structure is built on strong, duple meter. The tune was first published in "The Sacred Harp" in 1844, which was the main repertoire source of shape-note singing that was popular in the regions of the Appalachian Mountains. The offertory is an arrangement of Scottish hymn writer and minister, James L. M. Bain's (1860-1925) tune, "Brother James's Air." Again, the tune is influenced by the Scottish ballads that Bain would have been familiar with, its concaving melody; however, it is jauntier in nature in triple meter. Bain was known to be a lover of nature and was often spotted wandering about the hillsides and pastures, which is why the tune is often paired with the 23rd Psalm to complement its own pastoral imagery.


