## THIS MORNING'S MUSIC

The anthem was composed by the New York organist and church musician Harold Friedell. Friedell was choirmaster and organist at St. Bartholomew's Church on Park Avenue from 1947 until his death of a heart attack in 1958. The anthem, composed about a year before his death, credits the words to "B. R." They were actually written by Percy Dearmer, who wrote them for the 1931 hymnal "Songs of Praise Enlarged." Dearmer was editor for the book, so perhaps he used the pseudonym "B.R." so it would not appear that there were too many of his own hymns in the hymnal.

The offering anthem is a musical setting of the Aaronic Blessing from the book of Numbers. John Rutter, CBE (b. 1945), composed the piece in 1981 for the memorial service for Edward Chapman. Rutter had studied with Chapman as a pupil at London's Highgate School. The anthem is an endearing farewell to a dearly departed friend.

"The Trees of the Field" is a song by Jewish-American rabbi Dr. Stuart Dauermann. James Biery's postlude is published in Oxford University Press "Hymn Settings for Organists" series.
