Children are always welcome in worship at GPMC. An infant and toddler room (room 112) is available during the service should you prefer to leave your child with our wonderful caregivers. Feel free to use the glider rocker located underneath the side balcony at any time during the worship service with your child. Worship kits for children to use during worship are in blue bags located at each of the entrances.

We have a hearing assistance system in the Sanctuary. It includes a basic ear piece for people who just want a little boost to the sound. We also have a special neck lanyard for people with inductive hearing aids (also called telecoil aids), as well as a special pack and cord for Bluetooth hearing aids. These devices, pieces and lanyards are on the credenza toward the front of the Sanctuary.

DIGGING DEEPER

Middle Hour: CS Lewis Goes To Hell: "A Study of the Screwtape Letters," January 8 - 22. Oxford Don and Author CS Lewis burst onto the American stage with his Christian satire, "The Screwtape Letters." Written as a series of letters from a senior demon to a junior demon, Screwtape discusses the problem of temptation, the challenge of freewill and sin, and the battle between good and evil, all in a poignant, funny, thought-provoking way. Taught by Pastor Jeff, this three-week class will discuss some of the themes of the book, and how, through satire, Lewis provokes us towards a compelling vision of the God of the Christian faith. Participants are encouraged to read the Screwtape Letters alongside the class but is not mandatory. Join us in Barbour Chapel at 10:10am.

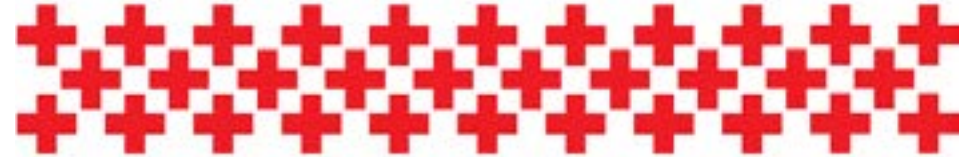
