CARILLON POSTLUDE

This Morning's Music: Focuses on standing firm with the Word of God using familiar texts from both folk and spiritual sources. Dale Wood (1934-2003) takes the text and tune from the early American shape-note hymn, "How Firm a Foundation" and sets it to varying arrangements for the choir to sing in a variety of textures, from bold unison to gentle four-part polyphony that emphasizes both the intimate and broad promises that Jesus makes to us to never leave us when dealing with life's trials. Another early American source comes from the African American spiritual, "Elijah Rock" that centers on triumphantly defeating the temptations that "Satan" tries to cast. This energetic arrangement by Jester Hairston (1901-2000) gives promise to its listener to just "stand on the rock where Moses stood" and submit one's faith in the Word.
