**This Morning's Music:** Celebrates the saints that have departed from their mortal bonds on Earth, as well as comforting those that feel their physical absence while keeping their spirits alive in memory. The anthem by American composer, Daniel E. Gawthrop (b. 1949) was commissioned with a goal to capture how music reflects the essence of life through all of its seasons - the last of which is the journey and arrival to heaven. The offertory comes from English composer, Andrew Lloyd Webber's (b. 1948) sacred choral work *Requiem*. The work is dedicated in memory of Webber's father who passed away in 1982. The work follows the usual structure of a Requiem mass, with the Pie Jesu as its most well-known movement. The text of movement comes from a larger set of text originating from the Latin sequence, Dies Irae, that is often set apart in most requiem masses. Webber's setting of *Pie Jesu* features two soprano soloists (sung by Carrie Fisk and Carol Ambrogio) that plead to Jesus to give rest for those departed. The full choir then addresses Jesus as the "Lamb of God" to grant the same request with united solemnity.



