This Morning's Music: Celebrates in thanksgiving at the end of the liturgical calendar as we recognize Christ the King! The anthem arranged by Katherine K. Davis (1892-1980) takes the familiar Welsh tune "Ash Grove" and sets it as choral anthem, utilizing different arrangements of vocal textures from two to five-part writing. Ralph Vaughn Williams (1872-1958) wrote "O How Amiable" as a festive piece to celebrate the dedication of a church and other high holidays in the life of the church, though the piece itself is reserved and meditative in nature with flowing melodic lines that start in the treble voices before joined by the tenor and bass. The piece samples text from Psalms 84 and 90, closing with a triumphant verse of "O God, our help in ages past" as we commemorate the "glorious majesty of the Lord our God" that is upon us.


