This Morning's Music

Morten Lauridsen's beautiful setting of the 10th century Latin hymn "O nata lux" is from his Requiem, entitled "Lux Aeterna," composed in 1997 (the year his mother died). Lauridsen was composer-in-residence of the Los Angeles Master Chorale from 1994 to 2001 and has been a professor of composition at the University of Southern California Thornton School of Music for more than 40 years.

"Hallelu" comes from the pen of the late Minnesota composer Stephen Paulus. One of the most prominent and prolific composers of our time, Paulus wrote over 400 works which have been performed throughout the world. After a major stroke in July of 2013, he passed away in October 2014. This hauntingly beautiful piece uses words from the traditional spiritual "Mary Had a Baby."
