POSTLUDE - Recessional on Regent Square

This Morning's Music: Is an intimate reflection on Christ's humble birth and the comfort it gives to those seeking it. The setting of the German chorale "Lo! How a rose E'er Blooming" by early 20th century composer Hugo Distler (1908-1942) is part his oratorio Die Weihnachtgeschichte (The Christmas Story). The excerpt of the work presented this morning uses isorhythmic techniques that makes each vocal part feel independent, yet interlock with each other. Distler found inspiration in using these compositional techniques from the 16th century works of Josquin des Prez. The offertory arranged by American hymnal editor Paul Wohlgemuth (1927-1987) is a simple, but beautifully crafted anthem on the 11th century plainchant Divinium Mysterium, that is often associated with the text that recalls the conception and birth of Christ. The first citing of the text and tune paired together comes from Piae Cantiones, a compliation of hymns and spiritual songs from the late 16th century.


