TONIGHT'S MUSIC

The carol text "Tomorrow Shall Be My Dancing Day" seems to have had its origin in the medieval tradition of the mystery play. The carol tells the story of Christ the Redeemer's incarnation among humankind, and calls us (his "true love") to follow him in his "dance" on earth. John Gardner composed this version in 1962 for his students at St. Paul's Girls' School in West London. It is sung all over the world and most notably by the King's College Choir at several of their Christmas Eve services.

In January of 2023, James Biery received a telephone call from Frank Pifferetti, Jr., director of traditional music at Wesley Memorial United Methodist Church in High Pointe, North Carolina, asking if he would be willing to write a choral piece for their 2023 Christmas Lovefeast service. He was happy to accept the commission, and during the summer months composed two pieces with the idea that Mr. Pifferetti could choose the one he wanted to use at his North Carolina church. He selected "Hear the Angels Sing," which uses the familiar words of the carol "It Came Upon the Midnight Clear" set to entirely new music. The other piece is a setting of Martin Luther's hymn "From Heaven Above," also with original music. Tragically, Mr. Pifferetti was killed in a horrific car crash on October 25. He was 58 years old.

The instrumental arrangements of the carols heard during the prelude, and four of the carols sung by the congregation, were composed by James Biery, and are published by Oxford University Press, GIA Publications, and MorningStar Music Publishers. Sir David Willcocks, director of the King's College Choir from 1957 to 1974, wrote the arrangement of "The First Nowell."

The Grosse Pointe Memorial Church Choir always welcomes new members. The choir sings a wide variety of sacred choral music, and regularly presents large-scale works.
