POSTLUDE – Improvisation of a Ukrainian Carol

This Evening's Music: Celebrates the joyous miracle of Christ's long-awaited birth! The instrumental prelude is an arrangement of the Italian Christmas carol for brass and organ by Pietro Yon (1886-1943) from the early 20th century. The tune presents pastoral imagery with lilting rhythms that resemble the nativity scene of the baby Jesus resting in peace. The melody derives structure from the chorus of the tune Adeste Fideles which is often associated with the carol, "O Come All Ye Faithful."

The choral prelude is a classic 19th century sacred Christmas song from French heritage. The poem was first penned in 1843 by poet Placide Cappeau (1808-1877) and then set to music by theatrical composer Adolphe Adam (1803-1856).

The anthem is a poem whose text is speculated to date back to the late medieval period. However, this arrangement of the text is set in a dance-like mixed meter by English composer John Gardner (1917-2011). The brightly spirited carol speaks in the first person of Jesus foreseeing his own birth and the glee that springs fourth from those around him. The offertory is by American composer Michael W. Smith (b. 1957) who has won critical acclaim for his compositions in modern, sacred and commercial music. "All Is Well," co-written with American songwriter, Wayne Kirkpatrick (b. 1961), is a choral anthem written to proclaim Christ's birth that starts with a gentle lullaby that grows with dramatic anticipation of Christ's arrival. The piece has been arranged and recorded by classical ensembles and popmusicians alike, with this arrangement orchestrated for brass quintet and choir to accentuate the majesty and lyricism of the anthem.

Grosse Pointe Memorial Church offers multiple ways for all to be involved in music ministry! The Sanctuary choir sings a wide variety of sacred repertoire from motets of the Renaissance to anthems from composers of today. The sanctuary choir also regularly presents largescale works and concerts for the Greater Detroit area as a way to minister the arts to the community.

GPMC also has a handbell choir for those that wish to engage in a music ensemble that presents monthly anthems and preludes in collaboration with the Sanctuary Choir.
