POSTLUDE – Improvisation on a Ukrainian Carol *Arr. Logan Hamilton*

This Evening’s Music: Celebrates the joyous miracle of Christ’s long-awaited birth! The instrumental prelude is an arrangement of the Italian Christmas carol for brass and organ by Pietro Yon (1886-1943) from the early 20th century. The tune presents pastoral imagery with lilting rhythms that resemble the nativity scene of the baby Jesus resting in peace. The melody derives structure from the chorus of the tune *Adeste Fideles* which is often associated with the carol, “O Come All Ye Faithful.” The choral prelude by René Clausen takes the text of Psalm 95, “Come, Let Us Sing to the Lord”, that adds the majestic fanfare of brass and organ to accentuate praise for God as the source of all creation. The piece closes with the *Gloria Patri* or Minor Doxology that praises the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit in glorious splendor. The anthem is the classic 19th century sacred Christmas song from French heritage. The poem was first penned in 1843 by poet Placide Cappeau (1808-1877) and then set to music by theatrical composer Adolphe Adam (1803-1856). This setting incorporates the brass ensemble to enhance the majesty of the carol’s telling of Christ’s birth and the commands He gives to those who celebrate His birth. The offertory, “Take Away My Sorrow” was commissioned in 2018 in the memory of choral conductor, Simon Davies-Fidler’s father. The piece expresses the realities of pain and sorrow in the world, while looking towards Christ’s birth as a sign of hope to all of those looking for comfort and peace.

Grosse Pointe Memorial Church offers multiple ways for all to be involved in music ministry! The Sanctuary Choir sings a wide variety of sacred repertoire from motets of the Renaissance to anthems from composers of today. The Sanctuary Choir also regularly presents large-scale works and concerts for the Greater Detroit area as a way to minister the arts to the community. GPMC also has a handbell choir for those who wish to engage in a music ensemble that presents monthly anthems and preludes in collaboration with the Sanctuary Choir.
