This Morning's Music: We are joined today by visiting soprano, Samantha Sayar, in sharing her gift of song during this Christmastide! The anthem this morning is a solo arrangement of the English carol, "The Little Road to Bethlehem," which was penned by Margaret Rose (1888-1958) in 1946 and set to music by pianist and composer, Michael Head (1900-1976). The poem tells of first-person perspective of the intimate journey to place where Christ was born. Rose in an interview, spoke how the sheep grazing on the hillsides of Essex.

The offertory is from Nico Muhly's (b. 1981) collection of the "O Antiphons" with this petition pleading for the "King of the Nations" to come and unite the body of humanity as one. This petition parallel's today's New Testament scripture with Paul's letter, "This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are heirs together with Israel, members together of one body, and sharers together in the promise in Christ Jesus." (Ephesians 3:6) The organ's response to the chant is a gentle lilt sounded on the cornet that sounds like gentle proclamation of a king's entrance into a land of peace of unity, which is echoed later by the buzz of the hautbois or oboe.
