*LIGHTING OF ADVENT CANDLE (HOPE)

One: Today we mark the beginning of the Advent season, entering into a season

of Hope. In celebration we light the candles of the Advent wreath, one each time we gather for worship. Every week, we add to those lit the week before,

and as the light grows brighter, our hope draws nearer.

All: The first candle is a candle of hope. Our hope is in the long-awaited Jesus, who first came to us as a baby. As we reflect on the ways and the whys of our hope, instill in us, Lord, a joy that knows no bounds. The joy that comes in welcoming new life.

One: On this first Sunday, we reflect on the reasonableness of our hope. We long for the coming savior, and we need the hope he brings. As a tender shoot emerges from the stump of a tree that has been felled, we can see the hope of new life that comes from meeting Jesus in our Advent journey.

All: God, meet us in the midst of our hoping. Give us the assurance that what you have promised us will come to pass. Forgive us for those times when we are tempted to despair, and light the fire of your hope in our hearts once more!

THIS MORNING'S MUSIC

The anthem is part of "Emmanuel Comes," a musical Advent service that Marilyn and James Biery wrote for St. Michael's Lutheran Church in Roseville, Minnesota, in 2003. "Listen to the Voice of Gladness" finds its inspiration in the words of the prophet Isaiah.

During communion the choir sings "Now the Heavens Start to Whisper," a hymn-text by Mary Louise (Mel) Bringle, who teaches at Brevard College in North Carolina. The words are set to the tune "Suo Gân," a traditional Welsh lullaby.

Bach's setting of "Wachet auf" is one of his most tuneful and familiar organ pieces. Originally a portion of a choir cantata of the same title, where the melody was played by the violins and the chorale tune sung by the tenors, Bach arranged it for solo organ and included it in the set of six "Schübler" chorales that he published around the year 1748.
