This Morning's Music: Looks forward to the arrival of Christ, as well as the promises that are fulfilled in his birth on this Second Sundy of Advent. The anthem presented by the Sanctuary and Bell Choirs spark petitions to Christ in four verses that offer collective hearts of love, peace, joy, and hope. The offertory takes text from the Magnificat (Luke 1: 46-66) to confirm the four petitions asked. Carson Cooman (b. 1982) sets this text in an epic narrative, opening with tremendous energy from the organ and choir, before venturing through various sonic textures in the choir. The Magnificat closes by recapitulating the opening flurry with a triumphant doxology recited in the choir.


