THIS MORNING'S MUSIC

The organ music and offering anthem today celebrate the musical gifts of black musicians Florence B. Price (1887-1953) and Fela Sowande (1905-1987). Price was born in Little Rock, Arkansas and was the first black woman to have a symphony performed by a professional orchestra (the Chicago Symphony Orchestra). In 2009, a substantial collection of her works and papers was found in her abandoned summer home. This has led to a renewal of interest in her music. Fela Sowande was born in Nigeria, studied and lived in London, then settled in the United States. His music has a strong Nigerian flavor which he combines with Western musical ideas.

In 1961 Benjamin Britten (1913-1976) was commissioned to write the setting of Psalm 100 that the choir sings this morning. The "Jubilate Deo" (the first words of the psalm in Latin) is a short, but challenging work, built upon two contrasting musical ideas. Following the contours of the text, the piece opens with a joyful, angular melody and a lively bell-like organ accompaniment, then moves into a quieter passage at "be thankful unto Him," and concludes with a return to the original idea.

The offering anthem is an African American spiritual arranged by William Henry Smith (1908-1944), who was professor of music at the historically black Wiley College in Marshall, Texas. This less well-known spiritual follows the typical "call and response" format with a soloist asking the question "are you ready!" and the chorus responding "yes, I'm ready to go."


