This Morning's Music: Are declarations of one's personal, steadfast faith and calls for the love of God to continually guide the heart and mind. The prelude provided by the carillon is an excerpt from a larger work originally written for the piano. The melody is based on songs from the Diné (Navajo) Enemy Way Ceremony. This ceremony holds a curative purpose, with the traditional songs serving as a significant part of the healing process. The anthem is an upbeat, gospel classic that is mostly known for its catchy refrain of "trust and never doubt..." The piece features two soloists referencing times of deliverance in times of trial. The offertory is a gentle setting to the George Herbert's poem, "The Call." It invites the steadfast love of God to embrace and inspire, that parallels today's preaching text, "Don't urge me to leave you or to turn back from you. Where you go, I will go, and where you stay, I will stay."
