This Morning's Music: Features selections from this afternoon's Sacred Songs in Blue concert! Will Todd's (b. 1970) "Kyrie" from his Jazz Missa Brevis is crafted as a jazz waltz that features clashing harmonies in the three lower voices while the soprano's keep up the opening melodic line that flows through the movement. Harry Burleigh (1886-1949) was a prominent American choral conductor and arranger, who took the Black spirituals he was surrounded by in his youth and arranged them into beautiful choral settings. His arrangement of "My Lord, What a Mornin" starts as a gentle lullaby, but infuses colorful, jazz-like harmonies that build to an emotionally charged statement of devotion. The piece recapitulates the opening melody while reshaping the harmonies before a gentle close to the piece.


