This Morning's Music: Places the emotional weight of searching and believing in the promises of God's omnipotence and intimate presence in our lives. The text from the anthem, "Lord, From the Depths I Call to You" is from Martin Luther's chorale written in 1523, that the author pleas to God to listen to his prayers of lamentation and spiritual conflict. The offertory is a paraphrased setting of Psalm 139 taken from the 1927 Psalter Hymnal and put to the haunting tune, "Tender Thought" anonymously composed in 1816. The tune is molded from the shape note singing traditions of early American hymnody, though the internal part writing shows a level of sophistication that is uncommon to the way these early American tunes were treated.




