With arms outstretched, God draws us near,



POSTLUDE - Solemn Processional on "O When the Saints Go Marching In"

In observance of International Women's Day, the service today features music written by women. The organ prelude is an arrangement by Marilyn Biery of a hymn tune by Sally Ann Morris (b. 1952), who is Musician in Residence for the Wake Forest University School of Divinity in Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

Mary Louise Bringle (b. 1953) wrote the words for "God Is Calling through the Whisper." "Mel" is on the faculty at Brevard College in Brevard, North Carolina, and was chair of the committee that created our "Glory to God" hymnal. The hymn reminds us of the many surprising and urgent ways God calls to us, both to draw us near and to send us forth.

"O Love" was composed by Elaine Hagenberg (b. 1979), an American who devotes her entire time to music writing. This piece is one of her most-performed choral works. The text she chose is the hymn "O Love that will not let me go," written by the Scottish clergyman George Matheson in 1882. He wrote that the hymn was written "with extreme rapidity; it seemed to me that its construction occupied only a few minutes, and I felt myself rather in the position of one who was being dictated to than of an original artist. I was suffering from extreme mental distress, and the hymn was the fruit of pain."

Marilyn Biery wrote the words for "The Heavenly Music" in 2011. It is a text about music as an expression of God's universal love. The songs that we sing and the music we make on earth are but a dim reflection of the glorious heavenly song – the song of God's abundant love. Jim wrote the music in June 2013, and it was published by GIA in 2015.

Catherine Winkworth (1827-1878) was an English hymn writer and translator. She is best known for her beautiful translations of German chorales, and "Now Thank We All Our God" is an example.

The organ postlude was written by Rebecca Groom TeVelde (b. 1956). Becky is organist and director of music at First Presbyterian Church, Stillwater, Oklahoma, and is a long-time friend of the Bierys.


