

This Morning's Music: Centers around the spirit and liturgy of communion. The prelude provided by the carillon is an excerpt from a larger work originally written for the piano. The melody is based on songs from the Diné (Navajo) Enemy Way Ceremony. This ceremony holds a curative purpose, with the traditional songs serving as a significant part of the healing process. The anthem is a choral duet of the communion hymn, "One Bread, One Body" that reflects the inclusive nature of assembling as the Body of Christ. The offertory is the Agnus Dei movement from Will Todd's (b. 1970) "Jazz Missa Brevis." The text of the Agnus Dei which is part of the Mass Ordinary in the Catholic church, is a text that reflects Christ's atonement of sin through the gift of communion. Todd's setting of the Agnus Dei text is beautifully crafted, as the repetitious nature of the liturgical words fuels the music's growth in volume and harmonic complexity, before resolving with the parting words "pacem" or "peace."
