This Mornings's Music

"How Can I Keep From Singing?" was written in the 1860s by Robert Lowry, a Baptist minister. It is often erroneously listed as a Quaker hymn. Lowry served churches in New York and New Jersey. He was known as a spell-binding preacher; hymn-writing was a sideline. This song was largely unknown in the 20th century until folk singer Pete Seeger sang it in the 1960s. In the 70s the Catholic folk music movement discovered it and since then the hymn's usage has spread to all Christian denominations. The arrangement sung by the choir was composed by Jay Althouse, a resident of Raleigh, North Carolina.

If you are looking for a little hearing assistance on Sunday mornings, we have a hearing assistance system in the sanctuary. It includes a new and improved basic ear piece for people who just want a little boost to the sound. We also have a special neck lanyard for people with inductive hearing aids (also called telefoil aids), as well as a special pack and cord for Bluetooth hearing aids. Not sure what kind of hearing aid you have? Try to find out, it will help us help you. These devices, pieces and lanyards are on the piano toward the front of the sanctuary. You can ask an usher for assistance.

Technology and the Holy Spirit Are a Mighty Team! (Adult Ed at GPMC isn't "remotely" shut down...see the details below.)

Friends: We are in the process of organizing adult education offerings to meet electronically/remotely, moving through the calendar sequentially to set up all of the connections between the groups and the technology.
