One: Amen. Hear the good news! The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance,





This Morning's Music: Juxtaposes the concepts of death and life in the lives of the faithful. The anthem by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750) is one of the many devotional songs that Bach contributed to the Musicalisches Gesang-Buch (musical songbook) published in Leipzig in 1736 by Georg Christian Schemelli. The text to this anthem describes the nature of Christ's obedience and journey to the cross through verses sung solely. The anthem concludes as a small motet where the choir sings of their own peace and salvation through Christ's sacrifice. The offertory on the other hand, turns its attention to the gift from the Holy Spirit that breathes life into all anew. The offertory uses the composer's hymn tune, "Bishop Powell" as the foundation for the piece, that weaves itself between bold unison and reverend polyphony. The text by Bessie Porter Head (1850-1936) describes the nature of the Holy Spirit that challenges faith and revives those who are weary in heart with the love of Christ.

Easter Gifts for Lilies & Music


