
*Prayer of Confession



This Morning's Music

The organ prelude is an interpretation of the familiar hymn "Amazing Grace." This piece is scheduled to be published in Oxford University Press "Hymn Settings for Organists" series later this year.

The "Song of Jean Racine," was written by Gabriel Fauré (1845–1924) when he was nineteen years old. The piece won the first prize when Fauré graduated from the École Niedermeyer (a school for the study of church music in Paris) and was first performed the following year with strings and organ. The text, "Verbe égal au Très-Haut," was written by the 17th century French dramatist Jean Racine. It is a paraphrase of an ancient Latin morning hymn.

The English composer Sir Edward Elgar (1857-1934) wrote the music for the offering anthem in January 1887 following the death of his father's friend (and Elgar's first employer) W. A. Allen. Originally composed as part of a Requiem, he revised the piece in 1902, adapting it to the Latin words "Ave verum corpus." In 2011, Marilyn Biery created the text that the choir sings today.

Gottfried August Homilius (1714-1785) was a German composer and organist active in the period following the death of J. S. Bach. His postlude is a setting of the 17th century hymn "Schmücke dich, O liebe Seele," traditionally sung during the sacrament of Communion. This piece was long attributed to J. S. Bach.
