THIS MORNING'S MUSIC

The Prelude music is an arrangement of the famous "Sheep May Safely Graze" soprano aria from J. S. Bach's Cantata 208, the "Hunting Cantata." It was composed for the 1713 birthday of Duke Christian of Sachsen-Weissenfels. In the cantata, the goddess of crops and pastures sings this beautiful song in praise of the ruler's benevolence. But it is not inconceivable that Bach's true intent was to create a pastoral tribute to Christ, the Good Shepherd.

"Holy and Beloved" was commissioned and composed for the GPMC choir in 2012. The impetus for the composition of this piece came from choir members Judy Masserang and Kevin O'Brien (and his late wife, Annie). They were also responsible for the choice of the beautiful text from Colossians 3:12-17. The music begins and ends with the choir singing a chorale-like unaccompanied setting of the words "You are God's chosen ones, holy and beloved." The qualities with which we "clothe" ourselves are echoed back and forth between the men and the women's voices, coming together as they sing of "perfect harmony." After another hymnlike passage singing of the peace of Christ, the music takes on greater richness as the choir sings of the word of God inspiring them to offer hymns and psalms. The piece concludes with a repeat of the opening chorale.

The anthem during the offering was composed in 2018. The piece was written for the Choir of First Presbyterian Church of Durham, North Carolina, who first sang it. The words are a wonderful ode to sacred music written in 1971 by Fred Pratt Green, a 20th century British Methodist pastor and hymn writer.




