POSTLUDE – Toccata on Easter Hymn

*Arr. Dr. Logan Hamilton*

**This Morning's Music:** Celebrates the risen Christ in splendor and glory! The instrumental prelude is an arrangement of the second movement to Johann Sebastian Bach's (1685-1750) cantata, *Jesu, der du Meine Seele*, BWV 78. This movement originally scored for soprano and alto duet, is rearranged for trumpet and horn in F. The text for this movement translated from its original German states, "We hasten with weak, yet eager steps, O Jesus, O Master, to you for help." The music sounds of rushing steps of glee as heard by both the dueting instruments and accompaniment. The choral prelude by the late American composer, Natalie Sleeth (1930-1992), is a partial Latin setting of the 100th Psalm which translates to, "Make a joyful noise unto the Lord." The piece then transitions to J. S. Bach's setting of the *Passion Chorale*, acknowledging the death of Christ through the thin texture of a sole, muted trumpet and choir alone. The piece then recapitulates the triumphant energy it started with to celebrate Christ's and humanity's victory over sin and death. The anthem by African American composer, Dr. Rosephanye Dunn Powell (b. 1962) is a joyfully crafted art song for choir and piano. The piece takes inspiration from the Song of Solomon 2: 7-13, which draws on themes of springtime and the fervor of love. The piece contains a carefully crafted piano part that is as integral as the voices, helping to set the various moods the piece captures from fluttering bird wings, to brewing storms. The composer comments on the piece, "Drawing from Romantic art songs and composers such as Franz Schubert and Robert Schumann, I have sought to express the poetry through both the voice and piano. Often in choral music, the voices reign in expressing the text while the piano plays a secondary role, providing mainly support harmonically and rhythmically. In 'Arise, Beloved!' I employed text painting to allow the piano to play an equal role with the voices in expressing this beautiful poetry." The clear implication of the word "arise" is prominent in the voices as they repeatedly sing ascending intervals, portraying a parallel in Christ's ascension and new life springing up from the dead. The offertory is a grand arrangement of the hymn tune *Engelberg* composed by the late Irish composer Charles Villiers Stanford (1852-1924). This arrangement weaves from bold declarations with voices in unison, to intimate vocal polyphony that confirms the intimate promises that bind us to God the Creator, Christ the Redeemer, and the Holy Spirit the Sustainer. **The congregation is invited to sing on verses 1, 2, and 4.**
