We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.



This Morning's Music

The prelude is the first movement of an organ concerto by Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach (1714-1788), the fifth child and second surviving son of J. S. Bach. He was well-regarded as a composer of music that paved the way for the classical style of Haydn and Mozart, and for his book "Essay on the true art of playing keyboard instruments."

The opening hymn is Marilyn Biery's version of the 13th century hymn "Veni Sancte Spiritus" which is usually attributed to Pope Innocent III or the Archbishop of Canterbury, Cardinal Stephen Langton. Sometimes called the "Golden Sequence," it is one of only four hymns of this type that were retained after the Protestant Reformation. The music is from a setting of a Christmas carol by the English composer Gustav Holst (1874-1934), well-known for his orchestral suite "The Planets."

Franz Joseph Haydn (1732-1809) wrote a large amount of music, including over 100 symphonies and a significant amount of church choral music. Most of the big choral masterpieces – "The Creation," "The Seasons" and the six great Masses – were composed during Haydn's later years. The "St. Nicholas Mass," by contrast, was written earlier, and probably for St. Nicholas Day, December 6, 1772, in honor of his employer, Prince Nicolaus Esterhazy. During that period, the church required that Mass settings last no longer than 45 minutes. Haydn and other composers managed to stay within this time frame by having different lines of the text sung simultaneously by the four sections of the choir. (This workaround occurs in the "Credo" movement as the choir sings the words of the Nicene Creed.)

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791) was the ultimate child prodigy. He was playing music on the harpsichord at the age of four and writing music at five. At the age of seven, his father took him and his elder sister Maria Anna on the first of several tours through Europe to demonstrate their amazing abilities. Wolfgang composed the "Veni sancte spiritus" for chorus and orchestra in 1768, at the age of twelve. This is not a setting of the Pentecost Sequence referenced above; instead it is a shorter text starting with the same words – Come, Holy Spirit - intended to be sung during the Offertory of the Mass.


