This Morning's Music: Features two of GPMC's woodwind friends, Keira Finley and Caroline Miller! The prelude composed by Hungarian clarinetist, Béla Kovács (1937-2021) is part of a series of homages honoring renowned composers such as Bach, Mozart, Paganini, and Debussy, expertly crafting short pieces in each of their distinctive styles. In the "Hommage à J.S. Bach," Kovács emulates the balance of virtuosity and structure, masterful harmonic progressions, intricate melodies, and baroque musical techniques and forms found in Bach's music, especially in his Sonatas & Partitas for violin. The anthem composed by Australian conductor, Alfred Hill (1869-1960), is a brief movement from this one of miniature trios composed to accommodate a variety of different ensemble possibilities. The Adagio from the first suite takes on a light-hearted quality with a simple marching rhythm that travels back and forth between the three players, until interrupted by a brief, lyrical interlude. The original character of the movement then returns to close the piece. The offertory by Austrian composer, Heinrich Molbe (1835-1915) is a fantastical work with a title that translates to "dream." The piece weaves lyrical dialogue between the clarinet and bassoon with the piano contributing added momentum and agitation during the development of the piece. The piece closes with the bassoon recapitulating the opening, haunting melody.


Infant and toddler room: Is available in room 112 during the service should you prefer to leave your child with our wonderful caregivers.




