

This Morning's Music

"On Eagle's Wings," by Michael Joncas (b. 1951), was written in the late 1970s after Joncas and his friend, Douglas Hall, learned that Hall's father had died of a heart attack. The song was recorded in 1979, then published, and first popularized in Catholic churches. It has since made its way into the services of Protestant denominations and appears in our own "Glory to God" hymnal. Michael Joncas is an ordained Catholic priest who teaches at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota. The Handbell Prelude arrangement is by Lloyd Larson, a prolific composer of music for church, who lives in the Minneapolis area. The arrangement sung during Communion was written by James Biery in 1995, before he went to St. Paul and met Michael Joncas.

"How Can I Keep From Singing?" was written in the 1860s by Robert Lowry, a Baptist minister. It is often erroneously listed as a Quaker hymn. Lowry served churches in New York and New Jersey. He was known as a spell-binding preacher; hymn-writing was a sideline. This song was largely unknown in the 20th century until folk singer Pete Seeger sang it in the 1960s. In the 70s the Catholic folk music movement discovered it and since then the hymn's usage has spread to all Christian denominations. The arrangement sung by the choir was composed by Jay Althouse, a resident of Raleigh, North Carolina.

The Closing Hymn was written in 1997 by the late Susan Palo Cherwien (1953-2021), a prolific and gifted Minnesota poet and hymn-writer. Interestingly, this hymn was influenced by a presentation by Michael Joncas (who wrote "On Eagle's Wings") discussing our identity as God's people, our choice in following Christ, and the cost of that choice. The music was composed by Timothy Strand (b. 1958), a church musician and organist who was a good friend of the Bierys, living only two blocks away in St. Paul.


