





This Morning's Music: The opening hymn has sparked controversy over the source of the hymn's tune, "Lyons", which is often miscredited to the popular 18th-century composer Joseph Haydn or his younger brother Michael Haydn. However, the most likely composer of tune is Joseph Martin Kraus (1756-1792) from his "Thema med variationer (scherzo)", a keyboard work possibly written in 1784 or 1785. The text is soundly credited to Sir Rober Grant (1780-1838) which paraphrases Psalm 104, "Praise the Lord my soul. Lord my God, you are very great; you are clothed with splendor and majesty."

The music to the duet is by American composer Richard Proulx (1937-2010) with text adapted from the Anglican bishop Chrisopher Wordsworth (1807-1885) that reflects praise in God's word and guidance.
