us once again in your loving arms, and enable us to follow you in worship and grateful service each day of our lives. This we ask in Jesus' name.


#### \*Assurance of Pardon

This Morning's Music: Features a guest soprano vocalist, Samantha Sayar leading as the soloist on the beloved hymn, "It is Well with My Soul," arranged by American composer, John Ness Beck (1930-1987), and the anthem "He Never Failed Me Yet," by American gospel composer, Robert Ray (b. 1946). Sayar is currently studying voice with a concentration in opera at Ohio State.

The origins of "It is Well with My Soul" comes from the pen of American lawyer and Presbyterian Elder, Horatio Spafford (1828 -1888). The tale of inspiration comes from the tragic tale of his wife and four daughters who were journeying across the Atlantic when their ship was struck by an iron sailing vessel. The accident had caused the death of Spafford's four daughters, causing Spafford to write the powerful text of comfort amidst times of trial.


