SESSION 1 –

Enjoy the videos with your students if you like. If they are working on their own, this is what we covered in the first session.

- Why do we learn about our Bible in 3rd or 4th grade?
- Is there more than one kind of Bible?
 - What makes them different?
 - What makes them the same?
- What do we know about Bible history?
 - The word *Bible* comes from a Greek word *Biblia* and means “books”
 - Bible was written over hundreds of years
 - Bible was written by many different people
 - Some parts of the bible we know exactly who wrote it. Other parts we don't.
 - Stories were passed down through the generations
 - Many of the Bible stories are included more than once in the Bible and were written by different people
- What are the parts of the Bible?
 - Two major sections for the Bible – Old and New Testaments
 - “Old” does not mean that this section of the Bible is obsolete – rather that the events in this section take place in history before the events discussed in the New Testament.
 - Old and New Testaments contain different books so the Bible is a library of books
 - Description of Old and New Testaments
