Grace and peace to you. Here are some of my ministry highlights from 2021:

- I served as your **Acting Head of Staff** for 8 months, and it was a special joy to preach several series.
- During those months, we created and worked through a **phased reopening plan**, returned to worshipping within our beautiful sanctuary, welcomed new members, held our first hybrid congregational meetings, hired multiple new staff, and called a pastor!
- Youth groups continued to meet outdoors and indoors, with an average of **15 youth each week**. Seekers and Sunday School relaunched for high school and middle school students.
- We led our first overnight trip since COVID began with a **high school mission trip to Detroit**. 15 youth and adults stayed at a retreat center and helped to clean up Rouge River Park.
- **God has been so faithful**, and GPMC members of all ages continue to learn, grow, trust, and support one another. The light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it. Thanks be to God!





# JAMES BIERY, MINISTER OF MUSIC & ORGANIST



During the first five months of 2021, the GPMC Choir sang hymns and anthems as a “virtual choir,” with singers video-recording their parts from home. I combined and edited all the individual recordings and provided the finished videos for our Sunday online worship. After over a year of a regular routine of about three virtual choir pieces per week, we posted nearly 300 videos on YouTube. All of these can be viewed on the church website. Here are some interesting statistics (as of Feb. 1, 2022):

- 231,819 total views of GPMC music videos, 637 subscribers



- Most-watched hymn has 22,268 views
- Many have over 1,000 views
- We routinely get requests from churches across the nation and in the U.K. asking to use one of our hymns in an online worship service. The GPMC musicians have touched a lot of lives!

Last fall, our Adult Choir and Handbell Choir returned to in-person worship. We were thrilled to see nearly all of our singers return, and to welcome four new singers to the choir: Nancy Combs, Lynn Huggins, Dave Pickering, and tenor section leader David Roberts. We welcomed Barb Glovac to the bell choir. The choir's return was made even more special with the first performance of a new anthem I wrote, "I Was Glad," commissioned by Judy Masserang.

A Summer Carillon Series was presented on four July Tuesday evenings. The series was coordinated by our resident carillonist, Michelle Lam. She played one of the concerts, and we heard guest artists Tom Gurin, Helen Hofmeister, and John Widmann.

The Music at Memorial concert series was back, too, and we enjoyed a brilliant program by the Detroit Brass Quintet in October. Marilyn Biery and three colleagues played a delightful concert of Scandinavian Music in November (with a special guest appearance by one of Marilyn's hand carved trolls!). In December the GPMC choir and orchestra presented their much-beloved Christmas Story concert to a very appreciative audience (pictured).

# SESSION



- Endorsed the Call of our new Pastor and Head of Staff the Rev. Dr. Jeff Lincicome and welcomed Jeff, his wife Kristi and their four daughters to GPMC on January 3, 2022.
- Bid farewell to Rev. Mark E. Diehl and his wife, Mary, as Mark concluded his interim time with GPMC in April. Rev. Sarah Godbehere was Acting Head of Staff until Rev. Jeff Lincicome began his ministry at GPMC.
- The Session approved the full report of the Re-opening Task Force and extended their work through June 30, 2022. Most recently Session approved a revised and simplified re-entry plan. With thanksgiving, the Session recognizes Rev. Sarah Godbehere, Ken Kamman, Holly Cory, Joe Masinick, Dan Aggas, Susan Griffin, Don Ditmars, Keith Bellovich, Ragan Graves, Sabina Dykstra and Lisa Turner for their work in 2021.
- Bill Ball “retired” after over 11 years as Clerk of Session and Lois Palazzolo was approved to serve as Clerk of Session for a term of one year.
- Approved the recommendation for the GPMC Board of Trustees to allocate the proceeds from a loan extended by the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) that was forgiven by the Small Business Administration (SBA).
- Endorsed Joseph Masinick's application to the Presbytery of Detroit Committee on the Preparation for Ministry to be enrolled as an Inquirer.
- The Session established the By-Laws Task Force which reports to Session and is charged with proposing changes to the By-Laws (Church and Corporation) and drafting a Session Operating Procedure. Members of the Task Force are Jeff Verbeek, Judy Masserang, Dave Buckler, Dan Grano with advisement by Debbie Bellovich, Lois Palazzolo and Marianne Grano (Presbytery of Detroit Stated Clerk)

# STEPHEN MINISTRY



- In 2021, 14 trained Stephen Ministers met, both virtually and in-person as allowed monthly to support one another in providing confidential Christian care to individual members of our congregation in spiritual or emotional need. Because of the pandemic, they met with care receivers by phone or sometimes outdoors, appropriately distanced.
- Stephen Ministry also provided sets of four grieving booklets to members who had lost loved ones.



# STEWARDSHIP COUNCIL



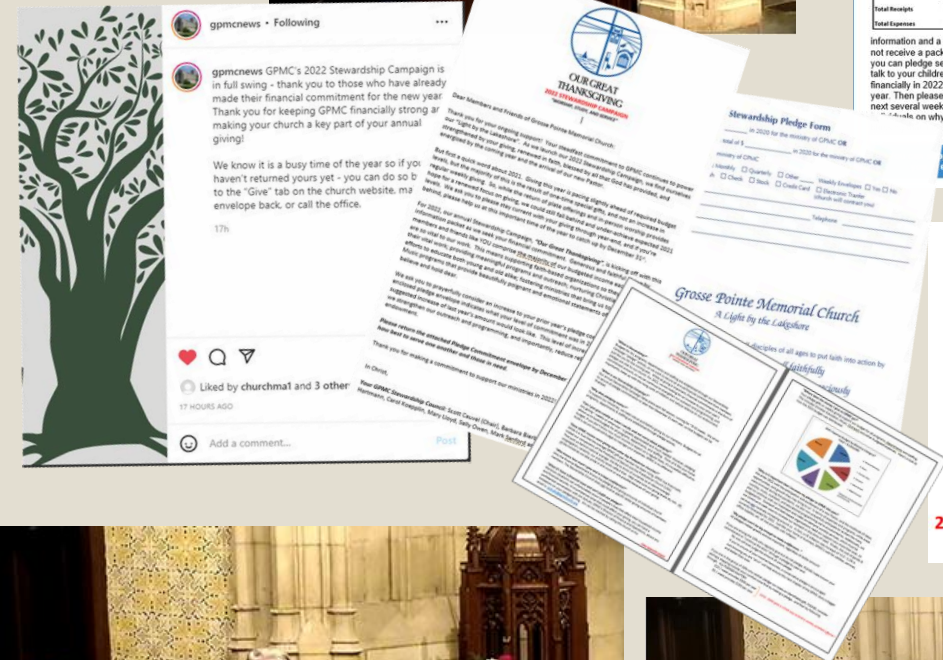
- The 2022 Campaign launched in late October with an in-home mail packet including cover letter, info on GPMC giving, and a pledge envelope to over 700 families

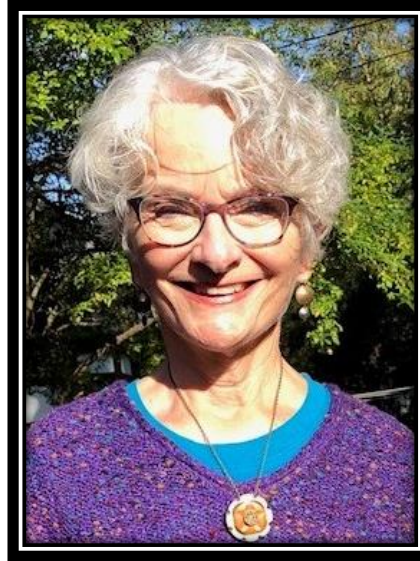

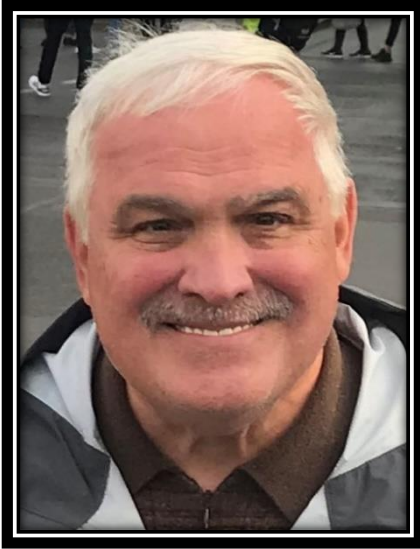

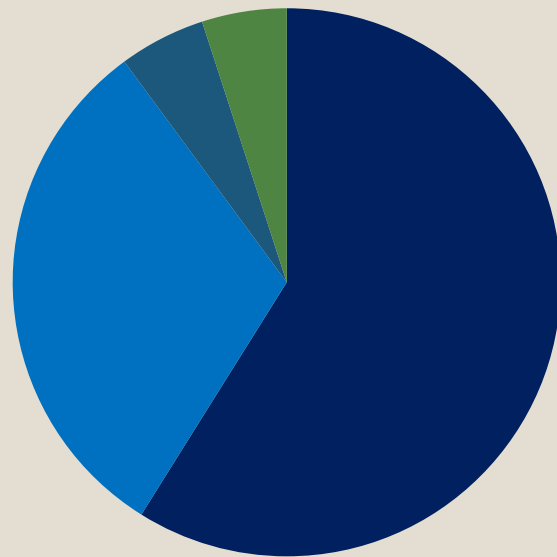

# 2021 OPERATING RECEIPTS & EXPENSES



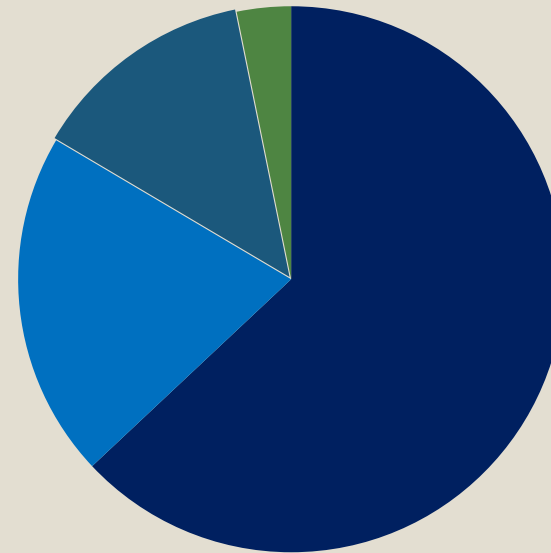
