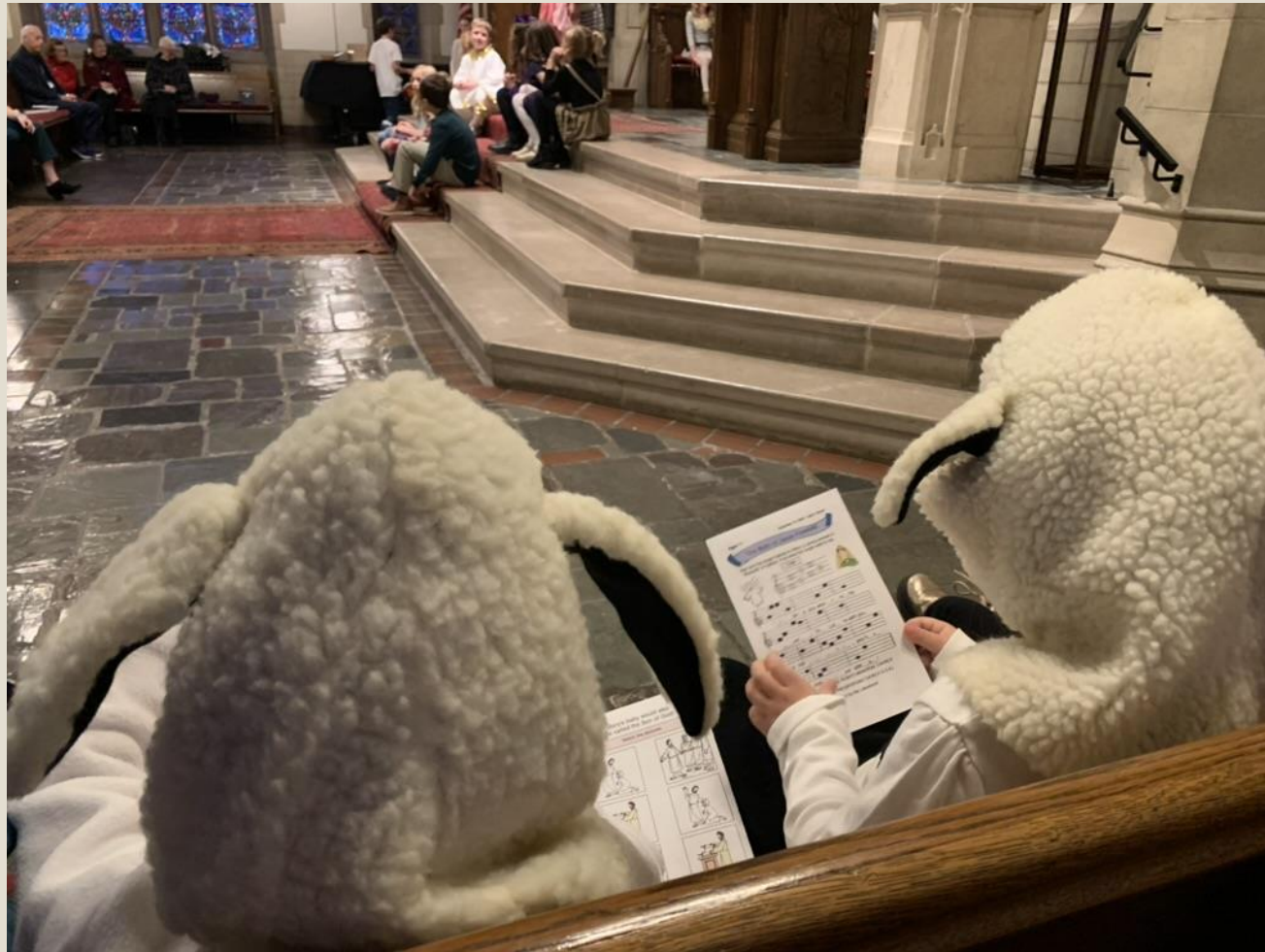

MINISTRY ARCHITECTS - LAUNCH



- Ministry Architects (MA) is a Christian consulting group that specializes in building & renovating sustainable, life-giving children's and youth ministries.
- MA has a proven track record of helping churches strength and multiply their children's & youth programming, as well as energizing the entire church around this common goal.
- In mid-November, MA conducted numerous "listening group" sessions with church leadership and congregation to hear our hopes, dreams and visions for Children and Youth Ministries.
- MA delivered a follow-up Assessment Report to the congregation in late November. This report:
 - Summarized listening group feedback
 - Showed how GPMC compares to norms across the country
 - Outlined the challenges and opportunities they see for us
 - Provided recommendations and a timeline to strategically move us forward with these ministries over the next 18 months



MINISTRY ARCHITECTS - NEXT STEPS



- A GPMC Renovation Team -- and a supporting Prayer Team -- has been assembled and began their work in early January.

- Renovation Team will work over the next 18 months to address immediate pressure points in Children & Youth Ministries; affirm a consensus for church direction; create GPMC infrastructure. This includes:
 - Assist staff in troubleshooting renovation challenges
 - Create extended stability plan for these ministries, e.g.: 18-month calendar, church directory, volunteer recruitment, staff support
 - Oversee long-term initiatives outlined in assessment timeline/process
 - Develop clear 3-year goals and 1-year benchmarks to ensure we stay on a steady, effective, 'results-driven' course
 - Communicate regularly with church staff and congregation about ongoing renovation process and our accomplishments over this 18-month timeline

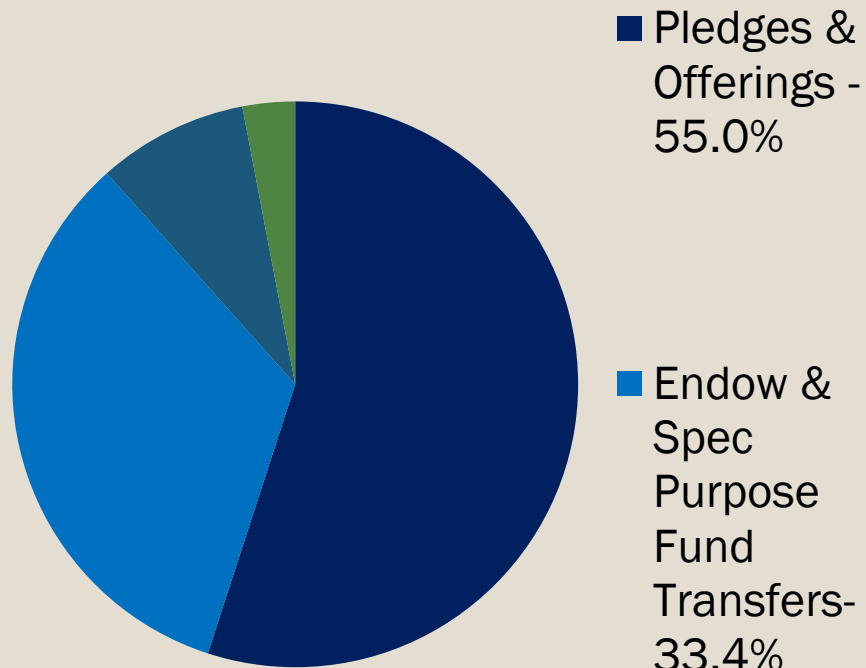

2022 OPERATING RECEIPTS & EXPENSES (000)

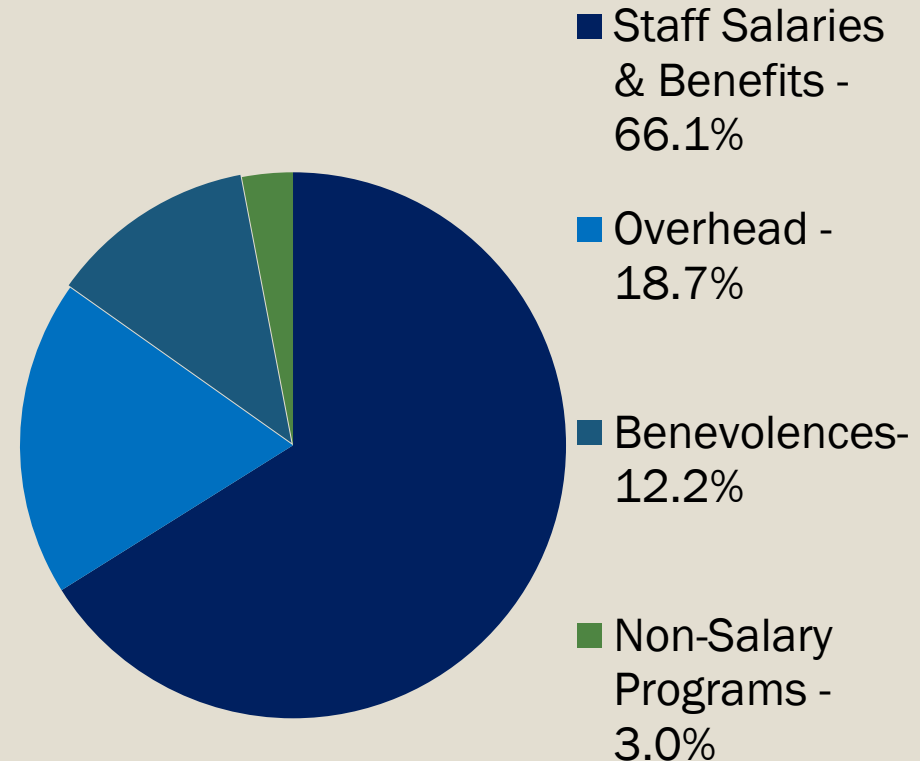

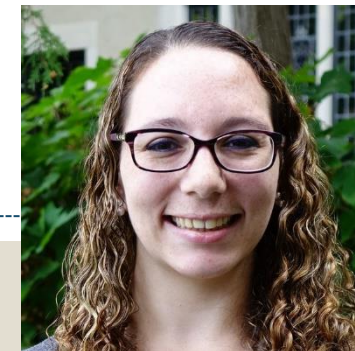

INTERIM DIRECTOR OF CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES



In the two brief but fruitful months since I had the honor of joining the staff of this church, where my husband and I were married and two of our five children were baptized, the many children's ministry programs have experienced exponential growth as we partner with Ministry Architects to renovate our foundational ministries to meet the changing needs of our children and families. Of note, since late November 2022:

- Third and fourth graders completed Bible class and received their Bibles with a blessing from longtime members
- Live Christmas pageant featuring 21 children and youth
- Monthly chapel in the sanctuary with children and teachers from Mornings at Memorial
- Weekly Young Children and Worship led by four dedicated volunteers has grown from an average of 5 children to a January average of 18 children
- Middle Hour Sunday school led by four volunteers has doubled, creating a need to open another classroom and include additional volunteers
- Four high school students have stepped in as Middle Hour Sunday school teaching assistants
- Birthday cards mailed to each child on our roster
- Preparation to launch Shine!, a Sunday evening program of the Word, music, crafts, experiments, and fun for 32 enrolled elementary schoolers
- Continued excellent care for children under age 3 in our nursery
- Digital children's check-in in place by the end of February

I remain energized for our continued children's ministries renovation in 2023!

- After working part-time as the interim youth director, I went full time in the position in June!
- We took 15 youth to Johnson County, Tennessee for a mission trip.

We helped Life Remodeled clean up a neighborhood, helped Second Mile and Starr PC with a Spring clean up, served lunch at Crossroads twice.

We continue to support and encourage Habitat volunteers and tutors for adults and children. We began planning a mission trip to New Orleans for hurricane relief.



DONATIONS MAKE A DIFFERENCE.

Outreach Council: Thank you for your leadership....it was a very good year.

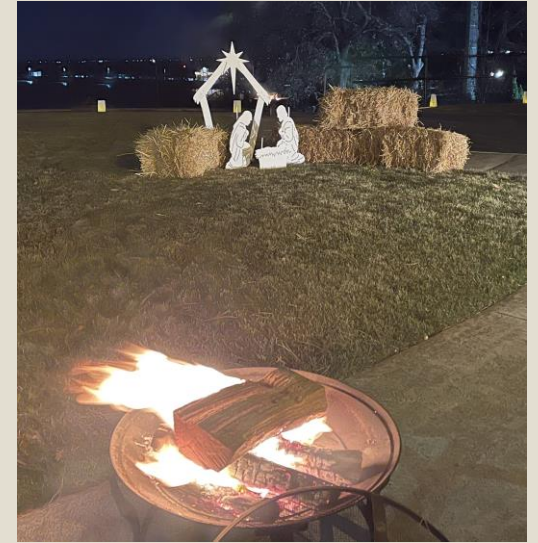

STEWARDSHIP COUNCIL

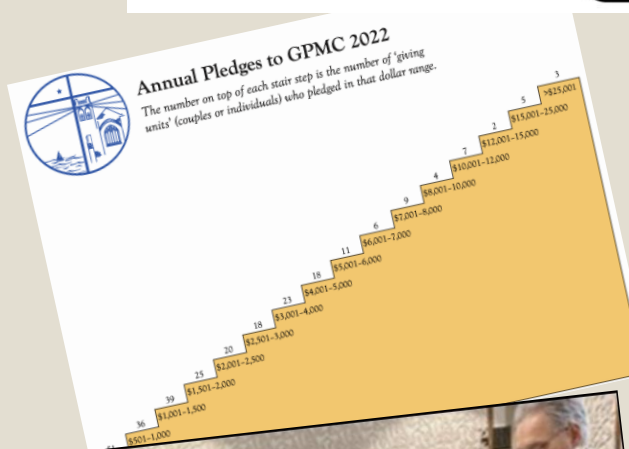
